- Scott has prepared a SECRET document for transmittal by placing the document in an envelope and annotating his office's return address, recipient's address, and the level of classification. Scott then placed the envelope into a second envelope and clearly labeled his office's return address and the recipient's address with no classified markings. Scott can:
 - a. Send the document through the U.S. postal service Express Mail or Registered Mail.
 - b. Send the document by FEDEX.
 - c. Send the document UPS.
 - d. Any of the above since the carriers can protect official U.S. mail.
- 2. Maria left work to go home at 5:00 pm. Maria also left a folder on her desk that contained a CONFIDENTIAL classified document. An afterhours inspection in her office suite was conducted that night and the folder was found on her desk.
 - a. Maria's actions represent a security infraction.
 - b. Maria's actions represent a security violation.
 - c. Maria's actions are acceptable because the building is guarded.
 - d. Maria's actions represent a definite security compromise.
- 3. Jill and Margie are both working on separate and distinct classified SECRET projects. Jill and Margie are both cleared to the TOP SECRET level. Jill is constantly asking questions about the nature and the status of Margie's classified project. Margie should:

Susan has determined the employee has a need-to-know the information that will be discussed at the meeting. Susan should:
