

The Center for Personal Protection & Safety provides this half day training to:

- Arm you with critical guidance on how to recognize and survive an active shooter incident.
- Empower you with knowledge and strategies for preventing and surviving an active shooter situation.
- Show you realistic dramatizations that depict the spectrum of decisive, proactive responses that can be used to increase the chance of survival.

Unfortunately, this violent event is occurring in our workplaces with catastrophic results. The odds of being involved in an "active shooter" situation are similar to those of being struck by lightning. But lightning does strike, and active shooter situations happen, and when they do the results are catastrophic. History shows that the immediate action of people on the scene is the most effective way to minimize or stop the violence. The key to survival is a proactive mindset.
